



2023 Deary - Hopeful Prep Camp June 21st to June 23rd, 2023

Who & What:

The Hopeful Prep Camp is the continuation of a camp which began in 1967. This year will mark a 56-year long tradition, though the format has evolved over the years. This camp is open to all ages, and is run in a clinic format with options listed below. Check the paradisecreek.ponyclub.org for updates!

Duration & Format of the Prep:

The prep will begin at noon on Wednesday, June 21st, continue all day Thursday, and Friday. You are welcome to arrive Wednesday morning, or Tuesday afternoon for those coming from further away (contact Lisa *see below* with Tuesday arrival requests). The first lessons will begin at 12pm on Wednesday. The lesson schedule will be sent to the email provided on the entry form by June 19th.

Maximum of 4 lessons per horse, or 6 lessons per rider (if bringing a second horse) *Intended format: 1 lesson Wednesday, 2 lessons Thursday, 1 lesson Friday.* You may sign up for fewer than 4. We are opening Friday up as a chance for additional cross-country lessons, and to utilize the second part of the course. Please be very detailed on the entry form as to your riding level so that we may place you in appropriate group (based on ability, age, certification & need).

<i>Lesson offerings: Wednesday (afternoon/evening) Thursday (all day) and Friday (morning/early afternoon)</i>	<i>Friday (evening)</i>
Dressage lessons Private lessons (1 rider – 45min \$70/ea.) will be limited, and available on a first come, first served basis. Semi-private (2 riders – 60 min – \$45/ea.) or group (3 to 4 riders – 60min – \$25/ea.) Group Stadium Jumping lessons 60min; (3 to 4 riders) - \$25/each Cross-Country Lesson 1.5 hours; (3 to 4 riders - \$40 each) Schooling jumps with an instructor. Additional time Friday, with opportunity to school at the water, bank, and onto the second half of the course. 2 cross country lessons max per horse.	Don't forget! 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Grounds Information

Directions	From Moscow: Go East on Highway 8, pass through Troy, and keep traveling east through Deary (about 3 miles past Deary. Shortly after mile marker #29, turn left into a dirt driveway, "Pony Club Road." Look for signs. Physical address: 5420 Highway 8, Deary, Idaho, 83823
Terrain & Camping Prohibited Substances	Wooded, rolling hills. Camping on grounds, no hook-ups. Hotels available in Moscow, ID (25 miles) One camping fee is included with each stall fee. Additional camping units = \$10/night. Spectators coming in and are planning to stay the night need to be aware there will be a camping fee. Please check in at the cook shack/event office. NO VAPING, SMOKING, OR MARIJUANA use on the grounds.
Stabling:	Nearly all 12x12 pipe panel stalls (not covered). A few of the old 10x10 railroad tie/pipe stalls without doors, so let us know if you want one of those for old times' sake! Bring your own shavings (no straw allowed) Stalls are limited and will be assigned upon receipt of <u>complete</u> entry. Stalls must be clean & stripped at the end of use. <i>No early arrival (prior to Wednesday AM) without prior approval. → \$20 per night</i>
Telephone:	Cell phone service is improving, and usually accessible on the top of the hill ☺ and in the town of Deary. The Deary camp phone number is 208-877-1381, however; you must use a calling card to call out on the landline.
Entries & Waivers:	Entry <u>must</u> be complete for stalls to be assigned and for you to ride. All persons planning to ride a horse on grounds <u>must</u> submit signed waivers. <u>Non-PC</u> -- the non-member waiver must be signed; this includes children and those not competing ("extra" horses will have stabling fees & must sign non-member waiver – page 4 of this entry form). Any outstanding accounts need to be settled before your entry will be accepted. You will be notified upon receipt of an entry.
Volunteering	We run on volunteers! Please check the white boards at the office for jobs we need help with during camp.
Late Entries & Cancellations:	<u>We will not accept late entries!</u> We move to Deary and cannot accept entries past the closing date of June 6 th . The prep fills fast – get your entry in early to ensure a spot. All cancellation refund requests will adhere to the Cancellation Policy below.
Horse Papers: Coggins Test, Brand Inspections & Health Certificates	An interstate certificate of veterinary inspection (Health Certificate) is required for travel between Idaho, Oregon & Washington, as well as having a current EIA (Coggins) test. Check with your vet for the current requirements – they change almost annually. Brand Inspections are HIGHLY recommended. <u>Please email copy of vaccine records for Equine Influenza (Flu) and Equine Herpes (Rhino) within 6 months to: Dearypcg@gmail.com</u>
Refunds/Cancellation Policy	Before the closing date, less \$10 (office fee). After closing date, less \$25, and only upon receipt of veterinarian or medical doctor's note.

RELEASE, ASSUMPTION OF RISK, WAIVER OF LIABILITY, AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT
FOR USPC NON-MEMBERS

This document waives important legal rights. Read it carefully before signing.

I AGREE for myself, and/or my child, my/our administrators and assigns, in consideration for my, and/or my child's, participation in this United States Pony Clubs, Inc. (USPC) activity to the following:

I AGREE that I choose to participate voluntarily in an USPC activity, as a rider, driver, handler, lessee, owner, agent, spectator, volunteer, and/or trainer. I am fully aware and acknowledge that horse sports and USPC activities involve inherent dangerous risks of accident, loss, and serious bodily injury including, but not limited to, broken bones, head injuries, trauma, pain, suffering or death ("Harm"). I fully understand that this release covers, but is not limited to, inherent risks of an equine activity which mean a danger or condition that is an integral part of an equine activity, including but not limited to, any of the following:

- The propensity of an equine to behave in ways that may result in injury, death, or loss to persons on or around the equine;
- The unpredictability of an equine's reaction to sounds, sudden movement, unfamiliar objects, persons, or other animals;
- Hazards, including, but not limited to, surface or subsurface conditions;
- A collision with another equine, another animal, a person, or an object;
- The potential of an individual during an equine activity to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury, death, or loss to the person of the participant or to other persons, including but not limited to, failing to maintain control over an equine or failing to act within the ability of the participant.

I Acknowledge that it is my/parent/legal guardian responsibility to ensure that I am/my child is wearing a completed wristband or armband card at this USPC activity. I authorize USPC, its successors or assigns, officials, officers, directors, employees, agents and/or volunteers to obtain and release to any USPC activity personnel (including, but not limited to, organizers, instructors, test examiners, chaperones), and to any first aid and safety personnel, medical professional, and treating medical facility, any information regarding my/my child's medical history, symptoms, treatment, exam results and/or diagnosis contained in the wristband or armband card. Furthermore, I agree and understand that it is my/parental/legal guardian responsibility to ensure that I/my child will not participate in any USPC mounted activities if I/my child have/had a head injury or other medical condition and have/been restricted from activity, until such time as the injury or condition is resolved and any activity restriction is lifted.

I AGREE to release the USPC, its successors or assigns, officials, officers, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers and affiliated organizations from all claims including, but not limited to, claims for money or property, disability, covenants, actions, suits, causes or action, obligations, debts, costs, expenses, attorneys' fees, judgments, orders and liabilities of whatsoever kind or nature in law, equity or otherwise, whether now known or unknown, suspected or unsuspected, and whether concealed or hidden, including but not limited to any state or federal statutory or common law claim or remedy of any kind whatsoever arising out of or in any way connected with any Harm to me or my horse and for any Harm caused by me or my horse to others, even if the Harm resulted, directly or indirectly, from the negligence of the USPC or the USPC activity.

I AGREE to expressly assume all risks of Harm to me or my horse, including Harm resulting from the negligence of the USPC or the USPC activity, and specifically agree to the applicable state statute/law regarding equine/farm animal activity liability and signed posting (if any), in any state in which I or my child participates in a USPC activity. While a list of state statutes and select portions of those statutes believed to be in effect at the time of the execution of this agreement is attached hereto, I AGREE to locate, review and understand the full applicable statute in place in my jurisdiction.

I AGREE to indemnify (that is, to pay any losses, damages, or costs incurred by) the USPC and the USPC activity and to hold them harmless with respect to claims for Harm to me or my horse, and for claims made by others for any Harm caused by me or my horse in the USPC activity.

I AGREE that neither I, nor any one claiming through me, will hereafter bring, commence, prosecute or maintain, or cause or permit to be brought, commenced, prosecuted or maintained, any suit or action, either at law or in equity, in any court in the United States or in any state thereof, or elsewhere, against the USPC, its successors or assigns, for, on account of, arising out of, or in any way connected with any Harm to me or my horse, and that neither I, nor any one claiming through me, will enforce, prosecute, or recover upon, or attempt to enforce, prosecute, or recover upon, any claim or right of action whatsoever, which I, or any one claiming through me, may now have or hereafter assert, in any way connected with claims for Harm to me or my horse, and for claims made by others for any Harms caused by me or my horse at the USPC activity.

I AGREE this Agreement is the entire agreement of the parties, and supersedes all prior oral and written understandings and agreements. This Agreement may be modified only by a written amendment signed by both parties.

I AGREE that if any provision of the Agreement is found to be invalid or illegal by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions shall be construed as if the affected provision had not been included in order to effectuate the intent of the parties.

In the event this form is signed by the parent/guardian of a minor, then all representations and acknowledgements herein are expressly made by, for, and on behalf of the parent/guardian and minor.

By signing below, I AGREE to be bound by all applicable USPC rules and all terms and provisions of the USPC activity. I acknowledge that I enter into this release after having read the same, and place my signature hereto of my own free voluntary act and deed. By signing below, I represent to the USPC that I fully understand its contents that I do not need any further explanation, and I waive any further explanation.

I have read and AGREE to abide by the above. REQUIRED — all signatures must be originals, not photocopies.
