





PALOUSE DRESSAGE AND EVENTING CAMP

The 45th annual Palouse Dressage and Eventing Camp is open to riders of all ages and ability levels. Our camp features:

- Dressage instruction with each lesson catered to the individual horse and rider;
- Small group jump lessons with stadium and cross country schooling available. Jump options range from pre-Beginner Novice to Training;
- Lunge lessons;
- · Ground work schooling;
- Auditing of other lessons;
- Casual atmosphere that fosters a productive learning environment;
- Gourmet catered dinners that can accommodate any dietary need;
- Free use of shower house with four individual showers available;
- Use of fully equipped kitchen with refrigerator and freezer space available;
- Demonstrations (i.e. saddle fitting, equine chiropractics, braiding, rider fitness, etc.);
- And the opportunity to engage with our instructors during non-riding times.

The Pony Club Grounds is on 90 forested acres just east of Deary, Idaho. It has 70 12x12 pipe stalls. Because of the size of our camp, we allow two stalls to be combined into one 12x24 as long as it is returned to its original configuration at the end of camp.

This year's instructors are:

- Marina Parris-Woodhead, who moved West a few years ago and has been mainstay at camp since;
- Major Jeremy Beale, who is joining us for the first time this year and will be teaching dressage and jumping;
- and Jesse Woodhead, who will offer lunge lessons and ground work after joining us last summer.

THE HATLEY RANCH

Pony Clubbers have been riding at the Hatley Ranch since 1967 when George and Iola Hatley opened it to Palouse Hills Pony Club for its annual rally. Their generosity and that of their son Craig, one of the first Palouse Hills' Pony Clubbers, provides us an incredible opportunity each summer. We would like to thank them for their friendship and support.

DIRECTIONS TO THE PONY CLUB GROUNDS

From the intersection of Highways 3 and 8 in Deary, the Pony Club Grounds is 2.2 miles east and on the North (left) side of the highway.

FOOD

Dinners for the evenings of July 5 and July 6 are available for purchase. Dinner for July 4 is included in your camp fee. Reservations must be made in advance for riders, family members and guests. Dinners include beverages, salad, main course and dessert. We ask that all dinner reservations be submitted by June 26. Please indicate any special food needs (allergy, vegetarian, etc.) on your entry. We are happy to accommodate.

GENERAL CAMP INFORMATION

- It is a camping atmosphere at Deary (no hookups). You will need to provide your own tent, camper, motor home, etc. (there is ample room).
- Horses will stable in pipe stalls (12x12). The daily fee per horse (\$10) is included in the overall camp fee. Also, because of the size of our camp, we allow stalls to be expanded to 12x24 as long as they are returned to their original configuration.
- Please bring your own bagged shaving (no straw please).
- We also are asking you to please use weed-free hay.
- The fee for camp includes lessons, un-mounted sessions, stabling and the dinner on Thursday, July 4 (lessons start on the morning of July 5).

MEALS

Catered dinners

- July 4 is included in your camp fee.
- July 5 and July 6 \$32.00 each night and includes dinner, beverage, dessert and gratuity.

You are responsible for your own breakfast and lunch but we have a large kitchen available for your use. Refrigerator and freezer space are on a first-come basis. Please make sure to mark your items. The kitchen is fully stocked with cookware and includes stove, oven, flattop, convection oven, dishwasher and microwave, as well as cookware and utensils.

Coffee, hot water and ice water will be available at all times at the cookhouse.

T-SHIRTS AND SWEATSHIRTS

As always, commemorative T-shirts and sweatshirts are available. T-shirts are \$12.00, sweatshirts \$30.00 and hooded sweatshirts \$35.00.

TELEPHONE

Cell phone coverage is improving in the area but there is a chance your cell phone will not work at the Pony Club Grounds. There is reception in Deary. There is a landline in the cookshack with a message machine. The number is 208-877-1381. Calling cards are needed for out-going calls.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

Non-riding family members and friends are welcome to join you. There are hiking, fishing and swimming opportunities in the area. We will be happy to provide suggestions.

GENERAL

- The number of riders accepted into camp is limited so we are asking for a deposit of \$200.00 to reserve your space. Please have your reservation in by <u>June 1, 2019</u>.
- REFUNDS will be given only if someone on the waiting list can fill your space.
- A negative Coggins test, health certificate and brand inspection are required for all horses coming to camp. Note: State Brand inspectors have made inspections at camp in the past and have issued citations.
- No fireworks are allowed.
- Dogs are welcome but must be on a leash at all times. Dogs are not allowed to be at the cookshack area at any time. Thank you!
- ASTM-SEI APPROVED HELMET REQUIRED WHEN MOUNTED.
- PLEASE BE SURE TO FILL OUT AND RETURN RELEASES AND MEDI-CAL FORMS WITH YOUR DEPOSIT.

LESSON OPTIONS

The schedule allows you to choose the number and type of lessons you would like. You may opt for one or two lessons per day – jumping, flat or a combination. Please plan on arriving at camp for dinner and orientation on Thursday, July 4. Included in the fee are Thursday night's dinner (\$32) and your stabling for camp (\$30). We are hoping campers can arrive by mid-afternoon Thursday so you can settle in and perhaps hack out before dinner. When you fill out your entry form, there are options for additional dinner purchases.

Marina Parris-Woodhead

Marina is the owner and trainer of Hidden Oaks-Horses, a premier Dressage training and sales business with facilities in Joseph, Ore. She offers training, lessons, clinics, judging, sales and purchasing assistance of quality sport horses and stands the imported KWPN, ISR/Oldenburg approved stallion – Pandorra.

Marina is a USDF Certified Instructor, USDF I Graduate Judge, FEI Level Trainer and Competitor, achieving the USDF Bronze, Silver, and Gold Medals. She has competed her stallion, Pandorra, in International Grand Prix competitions. The pair was ranked fifth in 2013 USDF Grand Prix Freestyle, was KWPN Champion, Region 6 Champion, and were long-listed for the 2012 Olympics. She also has talented upcoming youngters for competition.

A lifelong horsewoman, Marina began her riding career at age 4, progressing through a variety of disciplines until she discovered the benefits and intrigue of Dressage in 1986. Her students' successes include USDF Bronze, Silver, and Gold Medalists, Regional Championships, GMO Horse of the Year Awards, USDF National Awards, Arabian Sporthorse Championships, Reining, Barrel Racing and Western Dressage.

Marina embraces ongoing educational opportunities including clinics, training, competitions, and buying trips to Europe. She has enjoyed working with Conrad Schumacher for 15 years as well as with such notables as Lilo Fore, Ingrid Klimke, and Steffen Peters – among others. Her Classical European Dressage Methodology is supported and tempered with more than 40 years of practical horse experience and enhanced with a touch of fun!

Jeremy Beale

Major Beale was a reserve rider for the British Equestrian Team for the 1960 and 1964 Olympic Games in Rome and Tokyo and won the prestigious Burghley 3 Day Event in 1965. Beale came to prominence when he first represented Great Britain at the European Three-Day Event Championships at Harewood, England, in 1959. That same year he was offered a place on the British Show Jumping Team for competitions in Belgium and Holland, but was unable to accept because of his commitment to the Three-Day Event Team.

He won the Burghley Three-Day Event in 1965 and had fifth-place finishes at the World Championships at Burghley in 1962, the European Championships in 1963, and the Badminton Three-Day Event in 1967.

After leaving the Army with the rank of Major in 1967, Jeremy came to the United States to take up the directorship of Potomac West, which subsequently became known as the Pacific Horse Center. In 1971, he moved to Chester Springs, where he established Pen-y-Bryn Equestrian Center after three years at Fox Hollow Farm.

In recent years he re-entered the competitive arena in the field of dressage, competing with much success through Grand Prix and earned his USDF Gold Medal. Beale has an extensive clinic circuit, which takes him the length and breadth of the country, as well as abroad. His services as a clinician are in great demand and his students have been successful through the FEI levels.

Jesse Woodhead

Jesse, daughter of FEI trainer and competitor Marina Parris-Woodhead, will be teaching our lunge and groundwork/horsemanship lessons. Jesse is a Fourth Level qualified dressage rider, who has ridden with noteworthy instructors such as Conrad Schumacher, Christopher Hickey, and of course her own mother, Marina Parris-Woodhead.

Jesse has been riding dressage for 16 years and currently is on the path to receiving her Silver Medal, having received her Bronze Medal in 2017. Jesse competed in the 2018 Region 6 Championships and received Reserve Champion in the JR/YR Third Level Championship, Reserve in the Northwest Dressage Third Level Freestyle with a 70 percent, as well as placing in the top eight Open Class for her Third Level Freestyle Championship. She also has experience with Western riding through 4-H and rodeo, and competed in Europe in stadium jumping.

Jesse is long-practiced in the art of classical horsemanship. She specializes in teaching the basics of dressage and finding the right exercises to help develop a rider's position and seat that can improve the freedom of movement for the horse and rider alike. She also has demonstrated skill in horsemanship with her ability to create a harmonious, respectful relationship between the horse and rider — everything from loading to herd-bound behaviors to general ground manners.
